The policy's main goal is "Creative India; Innovative India". At NSB, the IPR Cell was established on 15th July 2021. Faculty, along with students, bring a lot of research inputs, which are then pushed to get patents, copyrights, trademarks, etc. Cell believes that the scope of property rights has also increased from science to social science subjects.
